GENERAL INFORMATION

If for any unavoidable reason, such as bad weather, failure to receive state stipend funds, or other causes beyond the Fair's control, there are not sufficient funds, the exhibitor must accept discount in their prizes pro-rata with any such losses. In making your entry, you accept this as part of your contract.

Rules established by Superintendents of Departments must be fully complied with. Their decisions and their respective committee members will be final. No exhibitor shall compete against himself, either directly or indirectly, and any person entering borrowed articles, food, or other items, or making fraudulent representation in reference to any exhibit, will forfeit all premiums which may have been awarded. The Association also reserves the right to accept or reject any entry made for any premium offered, and no premium will be paid unless all requirements have been fulfilled.

There will be reasonable security day and night, but Association assumes no responsibility in case of loss, or damage to stock, or other exhibits from any cause, and on this condition only are exhibits accepted.

No premiums are to be awarded unless the article in question, in the opinion of the Judges, is meritorious. Collections and displays must be made up of specimens other than those entered in single classes.

Premiums in all departments will be paid as soon as possible after the closing of the fair. Premium checks will be forfeited if not cashed within 30 (thirty) days from the date thereof.

Judging on the exhibits (other than livestock) will be made by Monday, July 4th. Judges' awards as given in the award book will stand as correct under any circumstances.. Houlton Fair is not responsible for typographical or printing errors. Decisions of all Judges, in all departments, are final.

SPECS FOR ENGLISH CHAMPION HORSE: This year the course you make will be your own. You have lots of time to prepare. Music would be great!! Please keep the routine under 5 minutes; this is what you will be judged on:

- Walk, trot, canter, the transitions into all, each direction.
- Diagonal reverse at a posting trot.
- Demonstrate a figure 8 on X.
- Sitting trot,
- forward seat,
- Complete two jumps,
- End with a halt at X, back four strides
- Acknowledge the judge, walk off on loose rein.

You do not have to do these in this order, mix it up make it fun. You will be graded on each point listed. The higher the grade the better. Also there will be an overall score given to each rider based on smoothness of pattern. Make your own routine and show off your abilities!! Have fun with this!!

SPECS FOR WESTERN CHAMPION HORSE: As stated above make your own routine...these are judged points:

- Walk, jog, lope in each direction, and the transitions into all,
- Walk over bridge,
- Maneuver through poles,
- Lope a figure 8 pattern,
- Roll back,
- Barrel race,
- 360 each direction on haunches.
- End with a halt in center, back 5 strides,
- Acknowledge judge, dismount, exit ring.

You do not have to do these in this order, mix it up and make it fun. You will be graded on each point listed. The higher the grade the better. Also there will be an overall score given to each rider based on smoothness of pattern. Make your own routine and show off your abilities!! Have fun with this!!
